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Suggestion for your trip in Paris

You're a tennis fan, so I'm sure you're going to plan several days at the french Open. You can go for the full day, you won't have to worry about food, there are a lot of snack bars that sell delicious burgers and hot-dog. But don't forget to bring a hat and sunscreen if it's a sunny day! Also, I read that your boyfriend is a huge fan of music, and you wanted suggestions of concerts. You guys can check on Bercy's concerts. They aren't posted yet, but I'm sure you'll find something at the time. Close to the AccorHotels Arena, there is the really cute Bercy Village, a paved courtyard bordered with white stone storehouses and quiet terraces. It's absolutely adorable! There is a Five Guys where you can take a hot-dog and a milk-shake before a concert. Or if you're here for lunch, there is this restaurant named "Le paradis du fruit" (The fruit paradise), where you can compose your own smoothie with fresh fruit and order some delicious toast bread and salads. I already went there one time, and I wasn't disappointed! Now we got to talk about The Marais. This is a place you absolutely need to go during your trip. It's a little village in the 3rd arrondissement of paris that was built on marshland. There are a lot of museums of every time period. A museum you need to visit there is the Pompidou center, but you also can go to the Picasso museum. In this neighborhood the food is amazing, it's great for culture with the museums, it's romantic and safe, it's beautiful, and you can go shopping. Another place you need to go is the 10th arrondissemnt, along the canal Saint-Martin.
